Library Summer Reading Participants Have Chance to win \$529 College Savings Account

FRANKFORT, Ky. (May 10, 2022) – Four Kentucky children will win \$529 each to put toward a college savings account this year by participating in a summer reading program at their local public library.

The Kentucky Department for Libraries and Archives (KDLA), the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA) and KY Saves 529 have launched the Explore Oceans of Possibilities College Savings Summer Reading Sweepstakes as part of the 2022 summer reading program at participating public libraries across the commonwealth.

“The Summer Reading Sweepstakes is a fun way to encourage children to read during the break and learn more about what is offered in their local public library,” said Gov. Andy Beshear. “For many families, the local public library is one of the few places their children can go to access free educational resources, activities and programs.”

The sweepstakes, which runs May 16 – Aug. 12, 2022, will award four \$529 college savings accounts to Kentucky children and young adults 18 years old or younger. In addition, each winner's local public library will receive \$500 toward future reading programs.

After children participate in the summer reading program at their local public library, parents, grandparents or guardians can enter each child for the sweepstakes by filling out the entry form at <http://kysaves.com/oceans>.

BOATING SAFETY

Stay safe when setting sail

Electric safety is as important on the water as it is on the land. It's important to stay at least 10 feet away from electric power lines and other electricity sources when you are out on a boat. **Remember, water and electricity are a deadly combination.**

OTHER MARITIME MUST-DO'S

- If your boat accidentally comes in contact with a power line, whatever you do, don't jump in the water. Stay on board and don't touch anything made of metal. Don't leave the boat until it has moved away from the power line.
- If you notice a tingling sensation while swimming, the water could be electrified. Get out quickly, avoiding metal objects like ladders.
- When fishing, check for overhead power lines before casting your line.
- Equipment leakage circuit interrupters protect swimmers nearby from potential electrical leakage into the water around your boat. Consider installing them on both your boat and dock.
