In a separate drug related arrest, Isaacs said on Thursday, November 4, at approximately 12:16 pm, he received a complaint from the manager at Rocky Hill Heights Apartments on McCammon Ridge Road, a male wearing a blue ball cap was wandering around the apartment grounds and attempting to enter apartments.

When he and McKee Chief of Police Jonathan Sizemore arrived at the apartments, the manager advised Sizemore that the male had made entry into apartment #123 and the resident did not know who he was. Isaacs said they could see Jeffery Sizemore, 39 years old of Huckleberry Road, Manchester, KY, in the apartment and when they asked him to come outside, he did.

According to Isaacs, when Sizemore came out of the apartment, he had his hands in his coat as he sat down on a picnic table near the front door of the apartment. At that time, in Isaac's report, he said he and Officer Sizemore asked Jeffery Sizemore to remove his hands from his coat pockets and while he was obeying the officers and removing his hands, the two officers observed a small baggy fall from his left hand to the ground. When Isaacs conducted a search of Jeffery Sizemore, inside the waist band of his pants he could feel a round object and Sizemore stated it was a meth pipe.

Isaacs said he retrieved the pipe, and it had a very heavy residue inside. According to the report, Jeffery Sizemore stated to the officers that the baggy of suspected Methamphetamines was not his. He was arrested and charged with (1) Possession of a controlled substance 1st degree, 1st offense (Methamphetamine) and (2) Drug paraphernalia-Buy/Possess and transported to the Jackson County Detention Center where he remains at press time.

Closure of U.S. 421 in Manchester Ending Tuesday, Nov. 9, New Closure Taking Effect on Intersecting Route, KY 3480

Part of project to widen, improve U.S. 421/KY 80ubheading H2 Heading Supporting Text Goes Here

MANCHESTER, Ky. Nov. 6, 2021 – A section of U.S. 421 that has been closed since mid-June in Manchester will be reopened Tuesday morning, Nov. 9 as the contractor on a project to widen and improve the roadway moves to a different section.

The closure on U.S. 421 has been on a section three-tenths of a mile long (mile points 16.6 to 16.915) by a Wendy's restaurant. A temporary traffic signal has been used for traffic control at the intersection of U.S. 421 and KY 3480 North (Old Highway 421). When the road reopens, the traffic signal will be removed and KY 3480 will revert to being a stop with a NO LEFT TURN restriction.

At the same time, a second closure will take place on KY 3480 from its south intersection with U.S. 421/KY 80 (MP 0.00 to 0.075). Local traffic will retain access but through-traffic will be detoured onto U.S. 421. Detour signs and message boards will be placed to help guide drivers.

The closure is required for the project to widen and improve a section of U.S. 421. It will allow the contractor to construct a signalized intersection, excavate roadway and construct a storm drainage system in the closed area. The new closure detour is expected to be in effect until mid-December.

The date, time, and duration of work may be adjusted if inclement weather or other unforeseen delays occur.
