Remembrance Tree Ceremony Coming Dec. 2

It's sponsored by the Hospice Care Plus bereavement program to give community members a way to remember loved ones during the holidays.

Berea, Ky., 16 Nov. 2018— The annual Remembrance Tree ceremony is set for Sunday, December 2, at 2 p.m. at the ECU Center for the Arts. It's sponsored by Hospice Care Plus, Jackson County's provider of hospice, palliative, and bereavement care.

The event is a long-standing tradition, bringing hundreds together on the first Sunday in December for 25 years.

The Remembrance Tree ceremony gives the community a chance to remember loved ones during the holiday season by placing a personalized, memorial ornament on a remembrance tree. Hospice Care Plus sponsors the event as part of its bereavement program, which provides grief support services to the community. The ceremony is open to all, whether or not their loved one was cared for by Hospice Care Plus.

"Our bereavement program has always recognized that the holidays can be a hard time for people who've lost loved ones, even when those losses aren't recent," said Chasity Coleman, director of development at Hospice Care Plus. "It's a time of year when their absence is felt so strongly, yet there isn't a built-in way to acknowledge that hole they've left behind. The Remembrance Tree seems to do that for people. It gives us an outlet for those feelings."

After an opening prayer and holiday music, the ceremony continues with the reading of memorial names. Guests place their personalized ornament on the Remembrance Tree when they hear their loved one's name. If the person who requested the memorial ornament is unable to attend, a Hospice Care Plus staff member will place it on the tree for them. Guests are invited to enjoy a buffet of food and drink when the ceremony ends.

After the ceremony, ornaments will be taken to Hospice's Compassionate Care Center and placed on the Center's Christmas tree. Guests who wish to take their personalized ornament home with them may do so immediately following the ceremony, or they can claim them at the Compassionate Care Center anytime between December 6 and 31.

Anyone can request a memorial ornament. There is no fee for ornaments, but a donation--of any size--is encouraged. Proceeds from the ceremony cover the cost of the ornaments and help fund all programs offered by Hospice Care Plus.

Services include hospice care, palliative care, bereavement outreach, and hospice inpatient care at the Compassionate Care Center. All services are provided regardless of ability to pay.

KSP Holiday Food Drive Begins Nov. 21

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Nov. 19, 2018) – The Kentucky State Police will begin accepting donations for their ninth annual "Cram The Cruiser" holiday food drive on Nov. 21. Designed to provide non-perishable food items for families in need throughout the Commonwealth, the campaign will continue through Dec. 10.

"Hunger is an urban, suburban and rural problem," says KSP spokesperson Sgt. Josh Lawson. "There is no area of the state where it does not exist. Through this program, we have an opportunity to make a significant impact on the lives of our neighbors and participate in the spirit of the season."

Collection sites for donations have been established at all of KSP's 16 posts and six Commercial Vehicle Enforcement region offices throughout the state as well as the agency's headquarters in Frankfort. Visit the KSP website at kentuckystatepolice.org for a listing of the locations.

KSP is also teaming up with Kroger and Pepsi for special collection events on Dec. 1 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at designated Kroger stores throughout the state. The locations include:

- 1019 Cumberland Falls Highway in Corbin;
- 2835 S. Highway 27 in Somerset;

Suggested donations include non-expired canned fruit and vegetables, canned meat, macaroni and cheese, cereal, peanut butter, jelly, canned soups, chili or spaghetti sauce, brownie and cake mixes, coffee, water, powdered milk and juices.

The food will be distributed to local shelters, churches or other organizations in the areas where they are collected says Lawson.

"The holidays are a time when people come together to support one another. Last year, 419,507 pounds of food were donated from individuals, businesses, school groups, social clubs, scout troops and civic organizations throughout the state," he notes. "Feeding our neighbors is a noble cause, but it takes a team effort. Together we can take a stand against hunger and help make the holidays bright for families in need this year."
